## VI. THE PERFECTION OF PATTERNS—THE LORD JESUS CHRIST

  - 1. The word *compassion* consists of two components: "com" plus "passion."

    - a. Acts 1:3 defines the root word "passion" as suffering.
    - b. The prefix "com" means with.
    - c. Therefore, the compound word, compassion means to suffer with someone.
