## A. His Qualifications

## 1. Spiritual

- a. The missionary must be spiritually minded (Colossians 3:1-3)
- b. As opposed to being materially minded (Proverbs 15:17)
- c. As opposed to being carnally minded (Romans 8:7;
  - Colossians 3:5-15; 1 John 2:16)
    - 1) Not to walk in the flesh
    - 2) Not to fulfill the lust of the flesh
    - 3) To walk in the Spirit (Galatians 5:16)

## 2. Character

- a. When no one else is there to watch
- b. When all has went wrong
  - 1) Quote by Lester Roloff: "A test of a Christian's character is what he does after he comes to the blockade in the road and what his attitude is after everything has left him except Jesus."
  - Quote by David F. Reagan: "Develop a dogged determination to serve God no matter what. Otherwise, you will quit when the times get rough – and they will get rough.
- c. Examples from Scripture David, Daniel, Joseph, etc.
  - 1) David
    - i. A man after God's own heart (1 Samuel 13:14; Acts 13:22)
    - ii. A man obedient to those over him (1 Samuel 17:17-18, 20)
    - iii. A determination to stand for what was right, in the face of huge opposition (1 Samuel 17:20-54)
      - 1. Opposition from within Family opposition (1 Samuel 17:28-29)
      - 2. Opposition from without Friend(s) opposition (1 Samuel 17:32-33)

      - 4. Opposition from the enemy (1 Samuel 17:41-47)
    - iv. A determination to stand when it was convenient to give in to the critic (1 Samuel 24:1-12; 1 Samuel 26:5-12)

- 2) Daniel
  - i. A man of wisdom and understanding (Daniel 1:17-21; Daniel 2:14)
  - ii. A man with a testimony to the Gentiles (unsaved) (Daniel 2:47)
  - iii. A man willing to face opposition for right (Daniel 6:1-28)
- 3) Joseph
  - i. A responsible servant (Genesis 39:1-6)
  - ii. Favored by those that knew him (Genesis 39:4; Genesis 39:21)
  - iii. Full of character and integrity (Genesis 39:7-10)
  - iv. A man full of forgiveness (Genesis 50:15-21)
- 3. Ministry
  - a. Experience in a ministry
    - 1) Preaching opportunities
      - i. Street
      - ii. Nursing home
      - iii. Radio
      - iv. Congregation
    - 2) Jail ministry
      - i. This will give the prospective missionary a different audience to deal with
      - ii. This audience will be sometimes more willing listen. Why? They have come to a low spot in their life.
    - 3) Children's ministry
      - i. This is a great opportunity as one will very likely have some form of ministry geared toward children once on the field.
      - ii. You will more than likely have a Sunday school or more than one Sunday school for children
    - 4) A "one on one" ministry
      - i. Visiting the elderly
      - ii. Visiting the sick
  - b. A time of service in ministry
    - 1) Experience is a great teacher
    - 2) All of the above ministries (and more) that I have listed will more than likely be formed (in time) on the field
    - 3) The more time that the prospective missionary has here will help him in the long run out there.
    - 4) The missionary will have life lessons that will help him when he gets to the field.
