- A. Law
  - 1. Genesis Deuteronomy
  - 2. Five books
- B. History (Old Testament)
  - 1. Joshua Esther
  - 2. Twelve books
- C. Poetry
  - 1. Job Song of Solomon
  - 2. Five books
- D. Prophecy (Old Testament)
  - 1. Isaiah Malachi
  - 2. Seventeen books
  - 3. Sometimes divided into Major Prophets (five books) and Minor Prophets (twelve books)
- E. History (New Testament)
  - 1. Matthew Acts
  - 2. Five books
  - 3. Sometimes divided into Gospels and Acts
- F. Epistles
  - 1. Romans Jude
  - 2. Twenty-one books
  - 3. Sometimes divided into Gentile Epistles (thirteen books) and Jewish Epistles (eight books)
- G. Prophecy (New Testament)
  - 1. Book of Revelation

- A. Theme
  - 1. What is the major theme of the section?
  - 2. Does the theme of this section link it to another section of the Bible or does it separate it from other sections of the Bible?
  - 3. Is there a shift in theme within the section?
- B. People
  - 1. Who were the authors who wrote books in this section?
  - 2. Who were the people mentioned by name in this section?
    - a. Were they mentioned as being alive?
      - b. Were they mentioned as a point of history?
      - c. Were they mentioned as a point of prophecy?
  - 3. Who were the major people mentioned by name in this section?
  - 4. Who were the transitional men in this section?
  - 5. Who was the Lord's main messenger(s) in this section?
  - 6. Who was born in this section?
  - 7. Who died in this section?
  - 8. Who was married in this section?
- C. Places
  - 1. What places were named in this section?
  - 2. What place was the location where this section began?
  - 3. What place was the location where this section ended?
  - 4. Is there a place that was the major focus of this section (this may be broader than a city)?
  - 5. Can the section be divided based on the main locations given?
- D. Events
  - 1. What were the major events in this section?
    - a. Were the major events history?
    - b. Were the major events prophetic?
  - 2. Can the section be divided based on the major events?
- E. Time
  - 1. What dates were given within the section?
  - 2. What was the beginning date given?
  - 3. What was the ending date given?
  - 4. How much time did the section cover?
