

Historical Geography – Life of Christ

I. Birth to Baptism

A. Locations

- 1. Bethlehem
 - a. 5 miles south of Jerusalem
 - b. Prophesied (Micah 5:2)
 - c. Place of birth (Luke 2:1-20)
- 2. Jerusalem
 - a. Place of Mary's purification (Luke 2:22-24)
 - b. Jesus was 40 days old at this time (Leviticus 12:2-4, 5-7)
 - c. Christ seen here by Simeon and Anna (Luke 2:25-38)
- 3. Egypt
 - a. Fled here from Herod the Great (Matthew 2:13-15)
 - b. Jesus would have been less than 2 years old (Matthew 2:16)
- 4. Nazareth
 - a. Returned after the death of Herod (Matthew 2:19-23)
 - b. Home of Mary and Joseph
 - c. 80 miles north of Jerusalem
 - d. Jesus lived here until 30 years old
 - e. People of the city rejected Jesus (Luke 4:16-30)
- 5. Jerusalem
 - a. Visited when Jesus was 12 years old
 - b. Went to fulfil a Jewish custom (Luke 2:41-52)
- 6. Bethabara
 - a. Name means "house of crossing"
 - b. Place of Jesus' baptism (John 1:28)
- 7. Wilderness of Judah
 - a. Fasted there for 40 days
 - b. Time of temptation (Matthew 4:1-11; Mark 1:12-13; Luke 4:1-13)

II. Galilean Ministry

A. Locations

- 1. Cana
 - a. Location of first two miracles
 - i. Changed water to wine (John 2:1-11)
 - ii. Healed a nobleman's son (John 4:46-54)
 - b. Home of Bartholomew, i.e. Nathaniel (John 21:2)
- 2. Capernaum
 - a. On the northwest shore of the Sea of Galilee
 - b. Home of Matthew (Matthew 9:9)
 - c. House of Peter and Andrew (Mark 1:21,29)
 - d. Jesus made it "his own city" (Matthew 9:1; Matthew 4:13)
 - e. Where Jesus proclaimed Himself the "bread of life" (John 6:24,48)
 - f. Cursed by Christ (Matthew 11:23)
- 3. Sychar
 - a. In Samaria (John 4:5)
 - i. Location of Jacob's Well
 - ii. Conversion of the Samaritan Woman
- 4. Nain (see Life of Christ map 1)
 - a. 6 miles southeast of Nazareth
 - b. Jesus raised a widow's son (Luke 7:11-16)
- 5. Country of the Gerasenes or Gadarenes
 - a. On the eastern shore of the Sea of Galilee
 - b. Jesus cast devils from men there (Matthew 8:28-34; Mark 5:1-17; Luke 8:26-37)
- 6. Bethsaida
 - a. Name means "house of fishers"
 - b. On the northern coast of the Sea of Galilee
 - c. Hometown of Philip, Peter and Andrew (John 1:44; John 12:21)
 - d. Jesus healed a blind man here (Mark 8:22-26)
 - e. The 5,000 were fed near here (Matthew 14:13-21)
 - f. City was cursed by Christ (Matthew 11:21)



III. Later Ministry

A. Locations

- 1. Phoenicia
 - a. To the coasts of Tyre and Sidon (Matthew 15:21)
 - b. Healed the Syro-Phoenician woman
- 2. Caesarea Philippi
 - a. At the base of Mt. Hermon in the north
 - b. Site of Peter's confession (Matthew 16:13-16; Mark 8:27)
- 3. Bethany
 - a. Name means "house of figs"
 - b. Less than 2 miles from Jerusalem on the eastern slope of the Mt. of Olives
 - c. Home of Mary, Martha and Lazarus (John 11:1)
 - d. Christ ascended near here (Luke 24:50-51)
