### Political Geography of Palestine

#### I. IMPORTANT CITIES

#### A. Bethel

- 1. 12 miles north of Jerusalem
- 2. Originally called Luz (Genesis 28:19)
- 3. Abraham's encampment (Genesis 12:8; 13:3)
- 4. Name means "house of God"
- 5. Later called El-Bethel (Genesis 35:7); means "the God of the house of God"
- 6. Place of Jacob's dream (Genesis 28:10-22)
- 7. Taken by the children of Joseph (Judges 1:22-26)
- 8. One of the three places Samuel held court (1 Samuel 7:16); the other places being Gilgal and Mizpeh
- 9. One of the two places where Jeroboam set up a golden calf (1 Kings 12:28-33); the other being Dan in the north

#### B. Sodom

- 1. One of the five cities of the plain (Sodom, Gomorrah, Admah, Zeboim, Zoar) (Genesis 14:8)
- 2. Destroyed by fire and brimstone (Genesis 19:24,28; Deuteronomy 29:23)
- 3. Referred to in the New Testament (Matthew 10:15; Romans 9:29; Jude 7; Revelation 11:8)

#### C. Gerar – (See Palestine Before Conquest map)

- 1. Ancient Philistine city
- 2. Ruled by Abimelech (a name which served as a title, like *Pharaoh*)
- 3. Visited by Abraham (Genesis 20)
- 4. Visited by Isaac (Genesis 26)

#### D. Beersheba – (See Palestine Before Conquest map)

- 1. Name means "well of the oath"
- 2. Located in southern Palestine about midway between the Mediterranean Sea and the southern tip of the Dead Sea
- 3. Place of an agreement between Abraham and Abimelech (Genesis 21:31)
- 4. Residence of Abraham and Isaac (Genesis 26:33)
- 5. Allotted to the tribe of Simeon (1 Chronicles 4:28 see verse 24)

#### E. Hebron – (See Empire of David map)

- 1. Located between Beersheba and Jerusalem; about 20 miles from each
- 2. Other names
  - a. Kirjath-arba (Genesis 23:2; Joshua 14:15; 15:13)
  - b. Mamre (Genesis 13:18; 35:27)
  - c. Arbah (Genesis 35:27)
- 3. Abraham, Isaac and Jacob lived there (Genesis 13:18; 35:27)
- 4. Sarah was buried there (Genesis 23:17-20)
- 5. Joshua took it and Caleb retook it (Joshua 10:36-37; 12:10; 14:12)
- 6. David made it his royal residence (2 Samuel 2:1-4; 5:5; 1 Kings 2:11)
- 7. Joab killed Abner at its gate (2 Samuel 3:26-27, 30)
- 8. Absalom lived there (2 Samuel 15:10)
- 9. Chosen as one of the cities of refuge (Joshua 20:7)

#### F. Shechem

- 1. Located between Mt. Ebal and Mt. Gerezim north of Bethel and Shiloh
- 2. Other names
  - a. Sichem (Genesis 12:6)
  - b. Sychar (John 4:5)
  - c. Sychem (Acts 7:16)
- 3. Jacob lived there (Genesis 33:18)
- 4. One of the cities of refuge (Joshua 20:7)
- 5. Made Abimelech king for three years (Judges 9) \*not the same as the Abimelech of Genesis
- 6. Rehoboam was made king here (1 Kings 12)
- 7. Claimed to be a religious center by the Samaritans (John 4:5,20-21)

#### G. Bethlehem

- 1. Name means "house of bread"
- 2. Five miles south of Jerusalem on the road to Hebron
- 3. Other names
  - a. Ephrath (Genesis 35:19; see 1 Samuel 1:1 ("an Ephrathite")
  - b. Bethlehem Ephratah (Micah 5:2)
  - c. Bethlehem of Judaea (Matthew 2:1)
  - d. Bethlehem-Judah (1 Samuel 17:12)
  - e. City of David (Luke 2:4; John 7:42)
- 4. Given to the tribe of Judah (Judges 17:7)
- 5. Ibzan of Bethlehem judged Israel after Jephthah (Judges 12:8)
- 6. Elimelech and Boaz were Bethlehemites (Ruth 1:1-2; 2:1,4,11)
- 7. David was born and anointed there (1 Samuel 16:1-13)
- 8. David's three hero's brought him water from its well (2 Samuel 23:15)
- 9. Christ was born here (Micah 5:2; Matthew 2:1)

- H. Dothan (See Palestine among the Tribes map)
  - 1. About 11 miles north of Samaria
  - 2. Joseph was taken as a slave here (Genesis 37:17)
  - 3. Place of Elisha's vision (2 Kings 6:13)
- I. Jericho
  - 1. Name means "place of fragrance" of "moon-city"
  - 2. Located on the wide plain northwest of the Dead Sea
  - 3. Captured by Joshua (Joshua 6-7)
  - 4. Given to the tribe of Benjamin (Joshua 18:21)
  - 5. Rebuilt (1Kings 16:34; see Joshua 6:26)
  - 6. Jesus restores sight to the blind (Mt.20:30; Mk.10:46)
  - 7. Home of Zaccheus (Lk.19:1-8)
- J. Cities of Refuge (See Palestine among the Tribes map)
  - 1. References (Deuteronomy 4:41-43; Numbers 35:6-29; Joshua 20:1-9)
  - 2. Three west of the Jordan River
    - a. Kedesh in Galilee
    - b. Shechem in Mt. Ephraim
    - c. Hebron in Judah
  - 3. Three east of the Jordan River
    - a. Bezer in the plain of Moab
    - b. Ramoth-gilead
    - c. Golan in Bashan
- K. Levitical Cities
  - 1. Mentioned in Numbers 35:1-8
  - 2. Numbered 48 (this included the 6 cities of refuge)
  - 3. They were scattered throughout Israel
  - 4. They were home for the Levites
